



### **Certified Research Administrators**

The Certified Research Administrator (CRA) credential means that you demonstrate a level of knowledge of all aspects of research administration. It is obtained by qualifying for and taking the CRA exam, which is administered by an Independent certifying body, the Research Administrators Certification Council (RACC) http://www.cra-cert.org/@. The CRA exam is rigorous, and it must be taken at a designated site and it is administered through Professional Testing Corporation. In a four-hour period, test-takers must answer 250 questions that cover the full spectrum of research administration. The curriculum covered by the exam is referred to as the "Body of Knowledge@." The CRA credential means that you demonstrate a level of knowledge of all aspects of research administration.



 NIH implemented <u>new</u> requirements for Biosketches and Other Support, provided to NIH on or after 1/25/2022

## **Biosketch**

- **Template (including format) has changed -** make sure investigators are using the most up-to-date version
- Most significant change Section B: Positions, Scientific Appointments, and Honors
  - List in <u>reverse</u> chronological order all current positions and scientific appointments both domestic and foreign. Include:
    - All affiliations with entities or governments outside the United States
    - All titled academic, professional, or institutional appointments
    - whether or not remuneration is received
    - whether full-time, part-time, or voluntary (including adjunct, visiting, or honorary)

## **Other Support**

- **Other Support:** <u>Any</u> resources available to support <u>any</u> of an investigator's research endeavors
- Disclose ALL <u>active</u> and <u>pending</u> sources of Other Support
- NIH Other Support now in two sections:
  - Projects/proposals
  - In-kind (non-financial) resources

## **Other Support: Projects/Proposals**

- Projects/proposals, includes:
  - U-M projects, including those routed through ORSP, internally funded, etc.
  - Projects not routed through U-M or conducted as part of a non-UM appointment
  - Formal external consulting arrangements that involves the design, conduct, or reporting of research.

Examples include:

- Work that may result in publication in an academic journal
- Designing a protocol
- Data analysis
- Serving on a steering committee for a clinical trial

## **Other Support: In-Kind Support**

- In-kind resources that meet <u>certain criteria</u> must be included in Other Support
- In-kind resources can be a person, place, or thing.
- In-kind resources include, but are not limited to:
  - Personnel (e.g., visiting scholars, visiting students, supported by a non-UM entity)
  - Space (e.g., office space, lab space)
  - Equipment
  - $\circ$  Materials
  - $\circ$  Supplies

## **Other Support: Additional Details**

- The revised NIH Other Support format does **not** include separate sections for: Foreign Components, Foreign Appointments/Affiliations, Foreign Collaborations, Visitors
  - Note: Appointment/Affiliation, collaboration, and/or visitor information *may* need to be included as part of an individual entry for a project/proposal or in-kind resource
- For sources of Other Support that are not routed through U-M and are with an entity outside the US, provide **supporting documentation** 
  - Documents should be submitted in their original language and, if applicable, with an English-language translation (machine translations are acceptable)
- **Digital signature** is required, using a software application like <u>SignNow</u>

### **How RAs Can Help**


- Familiarize yourself with most recent sponsor requirements, and be on the lookout for additional changes.
- Ensure the following:
  - Correct sponsor format is used, including <u>overlap</u> statement(s)
    - For example, if none exist, state: "None of the active/pending projects listed above represents an overlap of science, budget, or committed effort."
  - Electronic signature is completed, as required
  - Flatten Other Support PDFs after signature to meet file size limit
  - Supporting documentation is included in Other Support, as needed

### **Central Office Other Support Review**

#### **ORSP Staff review all Other Support and Current & Pending Support for:**

- No expired projects in "Active" status
- No investigator reports more than 12 Calendar Months of effort
- Completed "Overlap" statement(s)
- Investigator signatures
- Compliance with sponsor formatting requirements

**COI Office Staff review Sponsor Documentation and M-Inform Disclosures** at JIT/Award for investigators with international engagements

#### **ORSP & COI Staff**

- Work with Project Team to make any necessary updates


### **Throughout the Award**

- New Sources of active Other Support (not pending) should be reported in the annual Research Performance Progress Report (RPPR).
- Previously undisclosed sources of Other Support that should have been reported at JIT or in the RPPR, but were not, need to be reported to NIH within 30 days.

Contact <u>Other.Support.Questions@umich.edu</u> immediately if you become aware of previously undisclosed Other Support.

• Seek prior approval for Foreign Components

### And Now, a Word from our Other Sponsors



- Generally, compliance with NIH's requirements means compliance with other sponsors (e.g., NSF). However:
  - Only NIH currently requires supporting documentation
  - Only NIH currently requires electronic signature
  - NSF requires overlap statements for each project
  - Consult the U-M <u>Disclosure Matrix</u> for additional sponsor-specific nuances





Anna J. Cooper, PhD, who was born enslaved in North Carolina, was the fourth African American woman to receive a doctoral degree. She was a sociologist, and is often referred to as the Mother of Black Feminism. She is the author of *A Voice from the South*, published in 1892 and thought to be one of the first articulations of black feminism.

- Looks at 4 factors: Foreign Talent Program, Denied Entity Lists, Funding Sources, and Association or Affiliation with Foreign Institutions or Entities

#### NSF Updated Disclosure Table (Biosketch/Current & Pending)

 Now includes start-up packages provided by proposing organizations or third party organizations

### NSPM-33

- Office of Science and Technology guidance to federal agencies
  - Standardize disclosure requirements and forms/formats across federal sponsors
  - Implementation must not stigmatize or treat unfairly members of the research community, including ethic or racial minorities.
  - Assigns Digital Persistent Identifiers (e.g. ORCID) to senior/key personnel
  - Will extend disclosure requirements to peer reviewers and advisory panels
  - Have grantees establish research security programs with training requirements
- Federal Agencies have yet to implement
- We are analyzing potential impacts on our current processes




